1. Give details of your current circumstances including the following points:

You may want to describe your connections to family, community, work, and economic situation in your homeland. Additionally, explain why you're not pursuing the program there.

2. Explain why you wish to study this course in Australia and at James Cook University Brisbane

Summarise JCU Brisbane: You may want to highlight our ranking, campuses, support services, and why you chose JCU Brisbane over others. Briefly outline the program's core/elective subjects, learning outcomes, and any practical elements like internships. Explain the requirements for studying this course and living in Australia.

3. Explain how completing this course will benefit you

State your motivations for applying and the course's value to your career goals briefly. You may outline your future plans including industry, target companies, and desired positions in Australia or your home country. Provide salary expectations post-course completion, comparing them to potential earnings in your home country.

4. Give details of any other relevant information you would like to include

This includes any information that you would like to provide in support of your application for e.g. your visa history, gap activities, reasons for double masters, course change, etc.

Important Notes

1. Attach screenshots of all websites, comparison tables that you have accessed online as evidence supporting your claims in GS Questionnaire. You may then **PDF the screenshots and upload on IMMI portal as 'Evidence - GS Questionnaire' as well as send to JCU Brisbane**. Don't forget to mark screenshots with corresponding numbers/file names so the visa officer and JCU Brisbane Compliance team can reference them back to your GS Questionnaire.
2. Generic statements unsupported by evidence are not given significant weightage in the GS assessment. This means it is important to provide evidence to support a claim made by the applicant.
3. You must upload JCU Brisbane approved responses to the above questions and **Evidence - GS Questionnaire** on the IMMI portal while lodging the online student visa application.
